<b>Course Description</b>	Diploma work thesis will be carried out under the supervision of the professor chosen by students, for their area of interest. By the end of the study cycle, the diploma work will be presented publicly. The diploma work must contain: Introduction, Working hypothesis, Literature research (State of the art), Material and Methods, Analyses and Results, Recommendations.
<b>Course Goals:</b>	The practical work aims to acquaint students with organizational structures in the field construction management and to enable them to participate in public service enterprises, local or nationally. The diploma thesis aims to enable students to cope with practical problems in the field Constructions and to use the knowledge and skills acquired in solving practical problems.
<b>Expected Learning Outcomes:</b>	Students will gain practical knowledge and experience in the field of sciences in question. They will also be able to transfer and apply the knowledge and skills gained during studies in the workplace and in solving practical tasks and problems. Students will also develop skills to plan their professional careers in the field of interest. Student practice problem solving based on the knowledge gained during the studies and the student's own work, under the supervision of a mentor.
<b>Teaching Methods:</b>	Fieldwork, Supervision by professionals in different fields, demonstration at the workshop, mentoring as well as compilation and maintenance of professional journal. Mentoring, Supervising the student's independent work, Consultations.
<b>Assessment Methods:</b>	Diploma Work estimated by the three-member commission form the academic staff. Public defence-presentation, Evaluation of the presentation, discussion and answering of questions by members of the Public Protection commission.
